THE FACTS

- People with disabilities in the U.S. are less than half as likely as their non-disabled counterparts to own a computer.
- 26% of people in the U.S. have some type of disability.
- People with disabilities are employed at less than 1/3 - 1/2 of the rate of those without disabilities.
- There are nearly 7 million students with disabilities, representing 14% of K-12 students in the U.S.
- Students with a learning disability are three times more likely to drop out of school.

01

Technology is one of the most powerful tools to make it possible to live independently. Providing individuals with disabilities access to technology promotes inclusion and builds life skills.

Assistive technology allows people with disabilities to overcome challenges in the classroom and daily life. Specialized assistive technologies like screen reading software, magnification devices, augmentative communication devices aid people with disabilities with verbal communication. Telecommunication relay devices have been used to promote independence and participation.

03

Rapid advances in technology lead to new tools that help people with disabilities thrive in the workplace. An inclusive approach to design is reimagining work environments to the benefit of people with abilities as well.

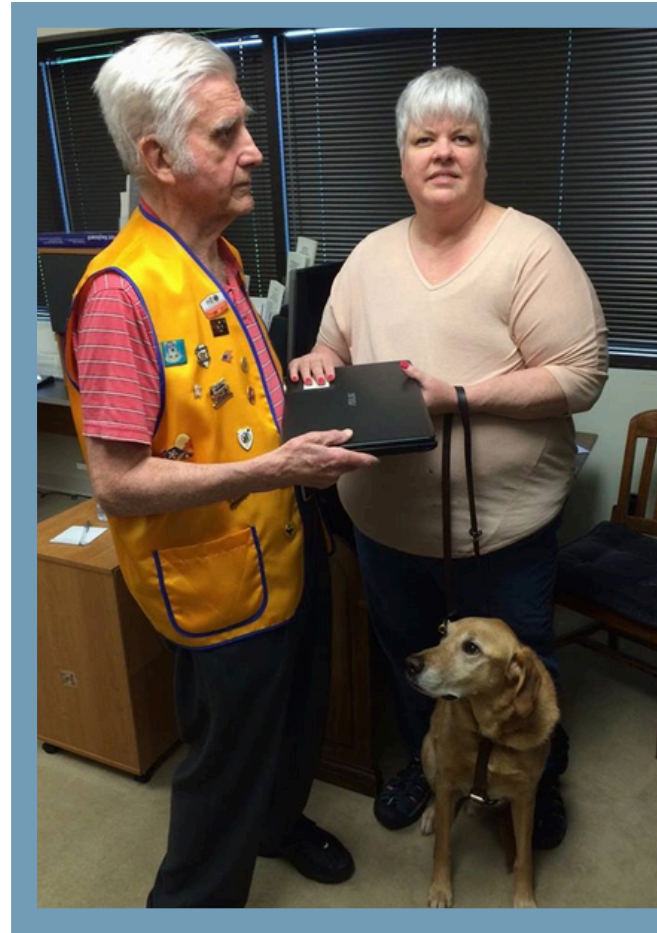
